
I love playing cards! A simple deck of 54 (inc. Jokers) can provide an unlimited amount of fun. Me personally, I love Solitaire games.

SCOUNDREL is my latest obsession when it comes to the solitaire genre. It's a rouge-like inspired dungeon crawler where you play a crafty rogue navigating their way through a dungeon, slaying all the monsters in your path with a dwindling set of resources.

It's a game about prioritising which resources you will use, and which you want to leave for later. In order to succeed you must take risks, punch above your weight and know when it's time to fight, and when it's time to flee.

I'm making it sound a lot more exciting that it actually is, but Scoundrel is genuinely some of the most fun I think you can have with a simple deck of cards. I'm currently working on an expantion or redesign of the rules which allow for long-term play, as I think that could make a fun solo game to play on the go.



Your handy <u>tear-out</u> guide for unorganising and running a local community event

Getting People Interested

The first thing you should know about running a BBQ is that it's easier to get people interested than you might think! While we can't promise you'll always get a good turnout, here's some tips and tricks for generating interest in your BBQ and finding others to come along:)

1) MAKE A COOL POSTER

This is your bread and butter. Write down some details, talk about the event and why you're running it, who you want to come, etc. Post it to socials and other places you're active (noticeboards, discord servers, etc), and make sure to invite all your friends along too.

2) START LOCAL

If even one other person comes to the BBQ and has a good time, it's a success. Try to pick a location that's easy to get to, with parking and/or public transport access. Parks and beaches are good, or shopping malls, or anywhere really.

3) FREE FOOD

This is really important!!!!! You can't have a BBQ without food. Bring some basics, sausages/hotdogs and bread are cheap. Make sure there's enough for everyone to eat. People who can afford it are usually happy to contribute.

+If you have too much food, people can take it home after.

What To Bring

This list is bound to grow over time as we run more events, but we've figured out a pretty good list of things to pack for your BBQ so it all runs smooth as butter.

Note: We use a public electric BBQ. You might need to bring your own cooker if they're not available where you live.

ESSENTIALS

• 2 pairs of tongs One for meat, one for veg

2 spatulas

Paper towel

Cooking oil

• Foil or baking trays Easy to clean cooking surface

Rubbish bags

Bottled water

• Lamp or lantern For cooking in the dark.

Headlamps are good too

GOOD TO HAVES

Apron Protects you from grease

Hand sanitiser

• Tape/weights To hold down cooking foil if it's windy

Sunscreen Be sun smart

• Bluetooth speaker

• Reusable plates+cups Washable camping equipment
